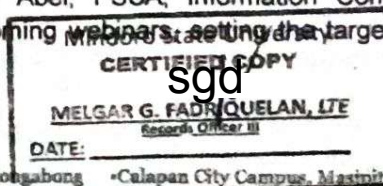

Furthermore, the institution is also one with the government in its aims to ensure that state laws are accessible to the public, understand them, and follow them. The understanding of these passed legislations is not just to make people know the consequences of their non-compliance but also to allow them in realizing their protected rights as citizens of the Republic.

As part of the Sessions of Project LEGAL AKO 2023, pursuing the goals of the organization and the core values of the institution, with air pollution being one of the many problems, the Organization sees the importance of disseminating and imparting knowledge on how the public be held accountable on the violation of R.A. 8749 or the Philippine Clean Air Act. In this regard, The PSSA spearheaded the LEGAL AKO 2023 Session 2 an online discussion on R.A. 8749 or the Philippine Clean Air Act with the theme A FRESH START: Air Pollution ay Tuldukan Langhapin Sariwang Kaalaman on February 15, 2023, Wednesday, 1-3 pm via Zoom and FB live particularly focused on the significant provision of Chapter 1 (Article 1 and Article 4), and Chapter 6 of R.A. 8749, the PSSA has conducted this online lecture through Zoom and Facebook Live.

On January 16, 2023, from 10:00 am to 11:00 am, Ma'am Ciedelle Piol-Salazar, PSSA, Adviser/ Campus Executive Director, Cyrah Mae C. Montero, PSSA, President, Erica Reyes, PSSA Secretary and Jheremy Abel, PSSA, Information Committee conducted a short meeting regarding the upcoming webinars, setting the target date.





target speakers and review the possible topic for the webinar. Ma'am Ciedelle then reminded the officers to align the topic of LEGAL AKO 2023 to LEGAL AKO 2022.

On February 8, 2023, Ms. Cyrah asked for the approval of Ma'am Ciedelle to her proposed date of LEGAL AKO 2023, Session 2 (February 18, 2023), the speaker (Atty. Joel Jandusay Jabal), and the Program on where Ma'am Ciedelle affirmed to. On February 10, 2023, Ms. Cyrah and Ms. Mary Rose Bulalague, PSSA Vice-President, visits Atty. Jabal's office to invite him as the guest speaker on the session 2 due on the complication on availability of Atty. Jabal, the date of webinar was then move to February 15, 2023, Wednesday. On February 13, 2023, Ms. Cyrah and Ms. Julie Justiniano, PSSA Treasurer reach out again to the HEIs of the 2nd District of Oriental Mindoro to invite their instructors and students to be an audience on the webinar. They send their invitation through the HEIs gmail and call them on the number provided by the HEI's that was given to Ms. Cyrah on her last visits to the HEIs. They also prepared communication letter to the university that to allow them conduct the webinar, it was then approved. Moreover, Mr. Jheremy Roman Abel then published publication materials about the event and the PSSA officers helps boost up the post and invites students to be part of the event.

On the early morning of February 15, 2023, Ms. Cyrah together with Ms. Mary Rose, Ms. Julie, Mrs. Mary Joy Yungot PSSA 3rd year Representative, Marc Caesar De Castro, PSSA Members, Mc Nhel Gallardo PSSA Member conducted a run-through of the event.

At 12:30 pm the zoom link was opened and the event host Ms. Cyrah Mae C. Montero welcome the beneficiaries, acknowledge the 2nd District HEIs and give an overview on what is Project LEGAL AKO. The event officially started at 1:00 pm with prayer, the national anthem, the MinSU Hymn, and with the welcoming message of Ma'am Jaziel Fabro CAS Faculty, Instructor. Ma'am Jaziel highlighted the importance of taking care of the environment, the responsibility, the accountability of the public towards our dearest environment, and the privilege we have in the implementation of R.A. 8749. Moreover, the PSSA officer plays an overview video of R.A. 8749 to give the audience preliminary information about the above-mentioned law. Furthermore, Ms. Cyrah introduced the guest speaker to the participants with a brief background of Atty. Jabal's educational attainment. After that, Atty. Jabal shared and discussed the significant provisions of the R.A. 8749 or The Philippine Clean Air Act, what it means, and how these help the environment of Philippine society. He differentiates different key terms, explains why the law existed, and applied the R.A. 8749 to a real-life situation that made the participants have depth knowledge about it. Moreover, he then answered questions from the participants during the open forum. He then emphasized that every youth, every student, and every citizen, needs to know the effect of this pollution and the ways we can manage its effect. He highlights that this law protects everyone and the State shall protect and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthy ecology in accordance with the rhythm and harmony of nature. Furthermore, to formally end the webinar, Dean Randy A. Quitain, Dean College of Arts and Sciences, delivered his closing remarks giving appreciation to every person involved on making the webinar successful. He then magnifies the importance of this kind of event to the youth and

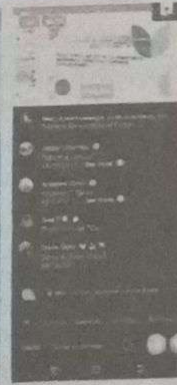
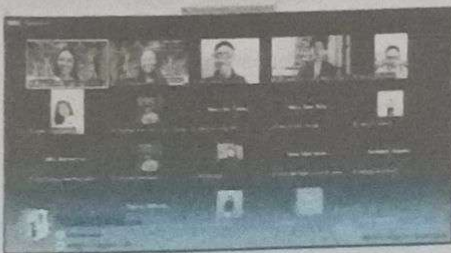
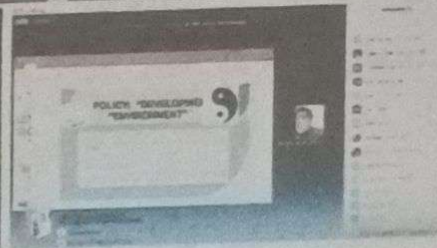

Child Prostitution and Other Child Abuse (Section 5); Article VI. Other Acts of Abuse; Article IX. Children of Indigenous Cultural Communities (Section 20); Article X. Children in Situation of Armed Conflict (Sections and 26); and Discussion of jurisprudence related to the above-mentioned topic.

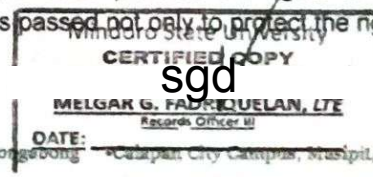
conducted a short meeting regarding the upcoming webinars, setting the target date, target speakers and review the possible topic for the webinar. Ma'am Ciedelle then reminded the officers to align the topic of LEGAL AKO 2023 to LEGAL AKO 2022.

On January 28, 2023, from 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm the PSSA officers headed by Cyrah Mae C. Montero PSSA, President presided over the virtual meeting regarding the Project "LEGAL AKO 2023" Session 1 discussing the tentative date of the webinar (February 4, 2023), the speaker (Atty. Larry M. Quinton), the topic (R.A. 7610 or the Special Protection for Children Against Abuse and Exploitation with the theme TO PROTECT AND SERVE: Kabataan ay Protektahan para sa sarili at sa Bayan), and the program of the event.

On February 2, 2023, the PSSA published a publication material advertising the webinar. On February 3, 2023, the Extension Office headed by Ma'am Jeane Lubos with the help of Sir Edmond Antolin assisted the PSSA officers in delivering the invitation to the different HEIs of the 2nd District of Oriental Mindoro. On the early morning of January 4, 2023, Cyrah Mae C. Montero received a call from the secretary of Atty. Quinton that Atty. won't be able to make it due to his poor health. Due to these unforeseeable issues the PSSA officers decided not to go ahead as planned, with Atty. and Ma'am Ciedelle's approval Ms. Cyrah rescheduled the event on February 11, 2023, and published an announcement re-scheduling the event on the PSSA official Facebook page.

On February 7, 2023, the PSSA published again a publication material regarding the new date of the webinar. On February 9, 2023, Cyrah Mae C. Montero PSSA, President, Mary Rose Bulalague, PSSA, Vice-President, and Marc Caesar De Castro, PSSA, member delivered the updated invitation letters about the webinars on the HEIs of Roxas, Oriental Mindoro. On February 10, 2023, Ms. Cyrah and Ms. Bulalague delivered the invitation letters to HEIs of Bongabong, Bansud, and Pinamalayan. On the evening of February 10, 2023, the PSSA officers presided by Ms. Mary Rose conducted a run-through of the webinar program.

On February 11, 2023, the PSSA finally implemented the Project "LEGAL AKO" session 1 a webinar tackling the R.A. 7610 or the Special Protection for Children Against Abuse and Exploitation with the theme TO PROTECT AND SERVE: Kabataan ay Protektahan para sa Sarili at sa Bayan. The said event was hosted by Ms. Mary Rose Bulalague PSSA, Vice-president, the event started by welcoming and acknowledging the students and learners from different colleges and institutions. The event officially starts with a Prayer, National Anthem, MINSU Hymn, and Opening Remarks of Ma'am Fleur Zriqat CAS Faculty, Instructor. Due to a connectivity problem, Atty. Quinton has trouble entering zoom. While waiting PSSA officers play an overview video about the R.A. 7610. After Atty. Quinton successfully enter the zoom, he then discussed the salient provision of the R.A. 7610. The discussion enlightens the audience about the mentioned state law. Atty. Quinton explains that this law penalized any forms of abuse including but not limited to physical, emotional, and physiological abuse against children. He also added that the state protects the rights and best interests of the children but primarily this law was passed not only to protect the rights of

the children but also those children who had been victimized by Criminal prosecution. Furthermore, Atty. discuss the criminal liabilities, and Consequences of the acts with a clear explanation emphasizing the scope of Republic Act 7610 including sexual abuse and physical together with criminal offenses. On the open forum, Atty. answer questions from the participants during the online webinar that helps the participants relate to it. Atty. also, clarify to everyone that there are enough laws to protect the rights of children. The laws providing people with penalties for child abuse include sexual assault in complex child abuse. Atty. added that the court is not precluded from ordering the parents to be deprived of their parental authority if they were found conniving with the accused/respondent with respect to be dismissal of the case he also emphasized that R.A. 7610 is a public crime under the criminal act, special kind of Criminal law. This title is the people of the Philippines versus the defendant this law is not focused only on penal nature, to give penalties, but to protect the right of the children. This program, being curated by the PSSA under its flagship program LEGAL AKO, particularly focuses on: Parental Authority (General Provision, Effect of Parental Authority upon the Persons of the Children, Effect of Parental Authority on the Property of the Children, Extinguishment of Parental Authority, and Substitute Parental Authority); Emancipation and Age of Majority (Emancipation, and Age of Majority); and Discussion of jurisprudence related to the above-mentioned topic.

target speakers and review the possible topic for the webinar. Ma'am Ciedelle then reminded the officers to align the topic of LEGAL AKO 2023 to LEGAL AKO 2022.

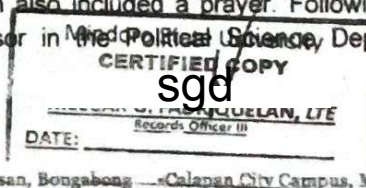
On February 19, 2023, Ms. Montero asked for the approval of Mrs. Piol-Salazar to her proposed date of LEGAL AKO 2023, Session 3 (February 25, 2023), the speaker (Atty. Maynard Gabayno Jr.), and the Program on where Mrs. Piol-Salazar affirmed to. On February 20, 2023, Ms. Montero sent an invitation letter to Attorney. Maynard Gabayno Jr. to be a guest speaker to discuss the salient provision of the Civil Code of the Philippines. Atty. Gabayno then positively accepted the invitation. On February 21, 2023, Ms. Montero and Ms. Julie Justiniano, PSSA Treasurer reach out again to the HEIs of the 2nd District of Oriental Mindoro to invite their instructors and students to be an audience on the webinar. They send their invitation through the HEIs gmail and call them on the number provided by the HEI's that was given to Ms. Montero on her last visits to the HEIs. They also prepared communication letter to the university that to allow them conduct the webinar, it was then approved. Moreover, Mr. Jheremy Roman Abel then published publication materials about the event and the PSSA officers helps boost up the post and invites students to be part of the event. On February 21, 2023, the PSSA published a publication material advertising the webinar.

On February 24, 2023, from 7:00 pm to 8:00 pm the PSSA officers headed by Ms. Montero conducted a virtual meeting for the designation of task and for final preparation for the webinar. Ms. Mary Rose Bulalague, PSSA, Vice-president presided over the virtual meeting regarding the Project "LEGAL AKO 2023" Session 3 discussing the venue of the host and and the time of the meet up of the officers.

On February 25, 2023, the PSSA finally implemented the Project "LEGAL AKO" session 3 a webinar titled "Beyond Control: Civil Relationship Between Parent, Child and in Between," the topics of Article XI of the Civil Code, which deals with parental authority, and Article XV, which deals with emancipation and the legal majority age, are discussed online. As the other participants wait to join the online conversation, it begins with an introduction of the speaker, Atty. Maynard A. Gabayno Jr., by the event's host, Ms. Bulalague. She provided an introduction of Project LEGAL AKO, before officially launching the online discussion. She explained that the series of webinars intends to increase public and youth awareness of the various state laws that bind and protect them.

Project LEGAL AKO's inaugural session, which focused on Republic Act 7610, the Special Protection Against Child Abuse, Exploitation, and Discrimination Act, was held on February 11, 2023, Saturday at 1 PM. It concentrated on the legislation that guards against sexual, physical, and emotional abuse of children. Furthermore, on February 15, 2023, Wednesday, the second Project Legal Ako session was held online and focused on the Republic Act 8749 also known as the Philippine Clean Air Act, a law that protect everyone from hazardous and dirty air.

The National Anthem and MinSU Hymn were sung before the formal commencement of the online event, which also included a prayer. Following this, the host invited Mr. Hilbert Perez, a professor in the MinSU Political Science Department at





Mindoro State University - Bongabong Campus, to deliver his introductory remarks. The host finally finished by introducing the webinar's guest speaker to start the discussion.

Parental Authority, which is already covered under Executive Order No. 209, Section 1987 of the Family Code of the Philippines, was the subject Attorney Maynard A. Gabayno Jr. launched the conversation on. He continued by defining parental authority in light of *Tonog v. CA 427 Phil. 1*. According to him, it derives from Article 209 of the *Samel Code*, added by the Rights and Duties of Persons Exercising Parental Authority.

He posed the query: Can Parental Authority be Renounced, Transferred, or Waived? and simultaneously provided an answer. According to Article 210 of the Family Code, parental power and duty may not be waived or transferred unless specifically permitted by law, hence the answer was negative. He then offered a legal precedent regarding *Leonel Santos Sr. v. Court of Appeals et. al. G.R. occurrence No. 113054* to aid in a better understanding of the specific subject which took place on March 16, 1995.

According to Article 21 of the Family Code, the father and the mother must jointly exercise their parental responsibility over the lives of their shared children, he said. He further stated that the father's judgment would take precedence in the event of a tie or disagreement. But, he said that in the case of an illegitimate child, the mother would be the one to exert parental control. He also discussed about the tender - age presumption, the one who exercise parental authority in case of absence, death, remarriage of either parent, or legal or de facto separation of parents, the substitute parental authority and its order, the one who'll exercise parental authority over the child if both paternal and maternal grandparents are still living, the parental authority in case of foundlings, abandoned, neglected or abused children, and other children similarly situated, the filial privilege rule, the special parental authority and its scope, jurisprudence on special parental authority, parents right to discipline the child, the liability of parents and other person's exercise parental authority, termination of parental authority, suspension of parental authority, emancipation and age of majority, and ends with emancipation and its effect.

Furthermore, Ms. Bulalague presented to Atty. Gabayno the certificate of recognition for imparting his invaluable knowledge and support for the event. After the discussion, the PSSA officers posted the post-test and evaluation form. Moreover, due to the connectivity problem, Doc. Randy Quitain, Dean College of Arts and Sciences has not been able to enter the zoom and Ma'am Jazielle Fabro delivered her heartwarming closing remark. The event ended with the signing off of Ms. Bulalague. On March 2, 2023, Ms. Cyrah with Ms. Julie Justiniano, PSSA Secretary visits Atty. Gabay's office to give their token of appreciation for his contribution to the webinar. After six (5) days the webinar gained 592 views and counting.

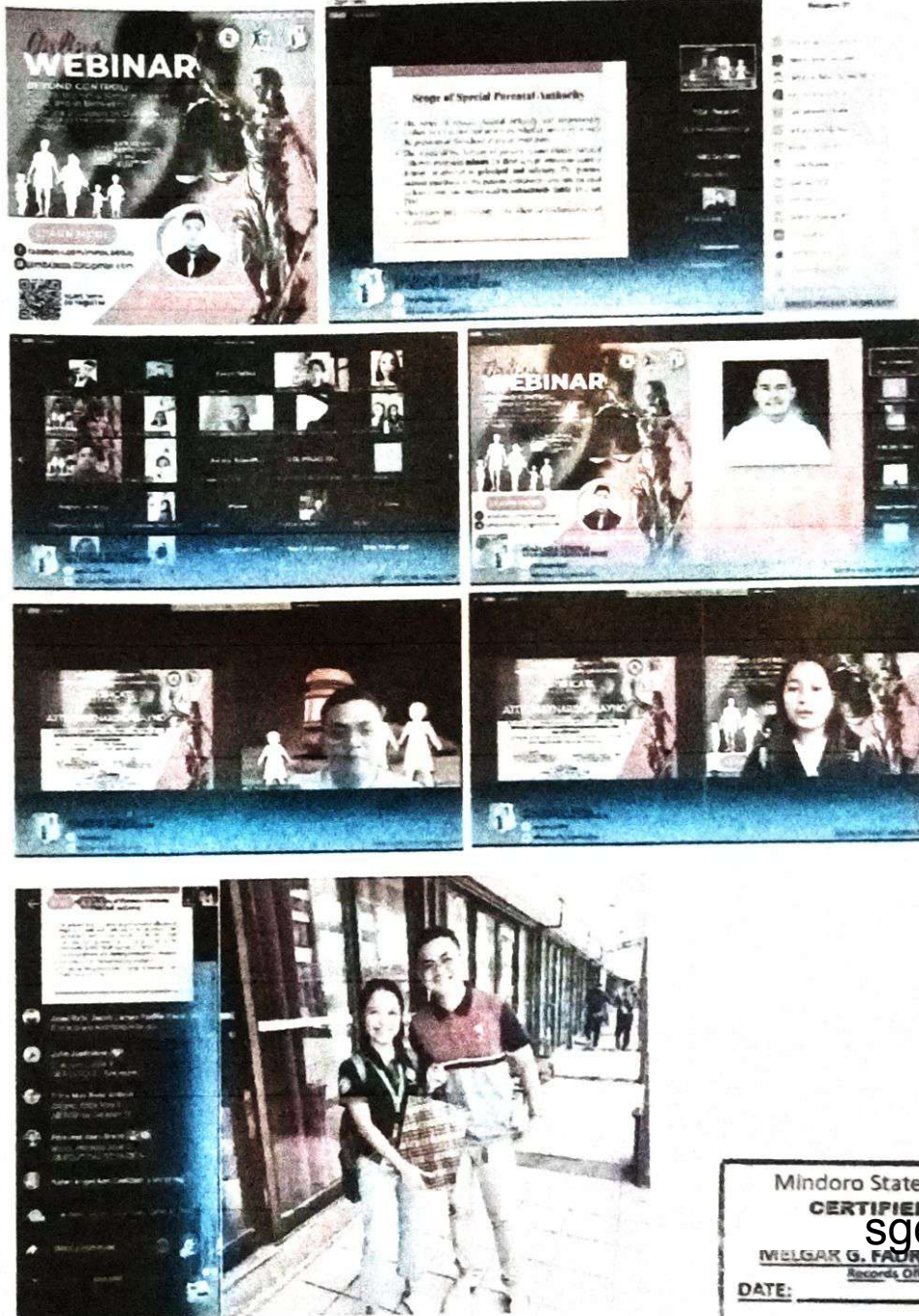

The Political Science Students' Association is an accredited organization in Mindoro State University – Bongabong Campus. The PSSA is a student-led organization that strives to provide an academic environment that expands students' knowledge and awareness in form of seminars, workshops, and issues forums. The Organization believes in the importance of implanting education not just to those who study political science but also in the community to which they belong. In an era where youth political participation is becoming more complex, the organization and the institution itself play a vital role.

In this regard, the Political Science Students Association (PSSA) in partnership with ADHIKA PH, Rehistro Mindoro, and the Local Government Unit of the Municipality of Bongabong came out with a plan on implementing Project LEAF at St. Joseph Academy, which was held on October 17, 2023. This program perfected its compliance with all the necessary documents before its implementation. Approvals of the admin were obtained, and students' waivers were secured.

The program was started at exactly 8:00 in the morning with the opening prayer led by Mr. Jheremy Abel, followed by the National Anthem, and the Opening Remarks of Ms. Rein Mhavel Coching, SAS Coordinator of St. Joseph Academy. As she gave her warm message, "Although ang ilan sa kanila ay hindi pa voters, pero alam namin na yung knowledge na magagailan ay magagamit para sa dating na election, at makapag-empower din sila ng iba pang voters specifically yung kanilang family, friends, brothers & sisters". She also mentioned the PSSA Adviser, PSSA Officers, Project Implementers, as well as the Rehistro Mindoro members under ADHIKA PH, "We are hoping our students, our student leaders, hoping na marami silang maiuwing kaalaman pagkatapos ng tatlong oras na ito", she added.

Ms. Jaziel M. Fabro, Program Chairperson of the Department of Political Science, gave her welcoming remarks for allowing the first session of P. Leaf to be conducted in their institution. As the hosts moved to another activity of the program, the PSSA Officers and Rehistro Mindoro Members led one of the icebreakers of the event, Shine Your Way Dance, as a warm up before proceeded to the discussion.

As the warm up dance ended, the hosts moved to another activity of the program by introducing the members of Rehistro Mindoro. Before proceeding to the discussion, Ms. Micah commence the goals of Adhika PH that it is a bridge of connection between youth participation and government, and is not only limited to voter's education but rather covered a wide range of training among youth future leaders. One of its projects is the Rehistro Mindoro. Due to the low percentage of voters in our province who have registered to vote, the Rehistro Mindoro, under Adhika PH, was created. Ms. Micah, Rehistro Mindoro members, initiate the Interactive Workshop on Voter's Rights, discussing the Chapter 1: Democracy and Governance. The first discussion was well-presented, defining the definition of Governance.



With a question of "How can you say that a Governance is Good?". Ms. Luna, one of the participants of the event, answered that "In my opinion, a good governance is yung naririnig ang boses ng bawat isa, karapatan na naibibigay sa kanila, nabibigyan ng maayos na pamamahala". Before the first topic has ended, nagkaroon muna ng interaction activities related to the discussion, specifically roleplaying. During the distribution of snacks to the participants, Ms. Christine Samino spearheaded the Electoral Process and Election Related Concerns on Chapter 2: Who to Elect? discussion. She discussed the Election Season dividing into National Election, Midterm Election, and Barangay and SK Elections. However, the topic highlights only the main Features of SK Reforms, its Qualifications, the Roles and Functions of SK, as well as the Role of the youth in local governance if not an elected official. And before the discussion ends, there was an Election Checklist activity comprising the sample ballot, candidate assessment card & Election Day Checklist. There is also a little sharing, answering the question why those are the qualifications they chose. "Marunong magpasunod as a leader, and marunong sumunod as a leader", one of the participants answered it.

As the discussion has ended, the hosts introduce Mr. Almond Sarmiento, on behalf of Hon. Lovely Mae Anulao, to give his message and heartfelt gratitude for participating in one of the extension activities of Political Science Students Association.

Mr. Mark Reiner De Guzman gave his Closing Remarks, as he acknowledged the St. Joseph Academy for imparting their support during the implementation of the first session of Project LEAF. "Given those messages for the youth development, i encourage everyone to make changes for themselves", he said.

The extension program was ended in the awarding of certs. And members who actively participate on the said event was given a token of appreciation, a t-shirt from ADHIKA PH members. The event was ended in a picture taking. Indeed, the program became very successful, the facilitators (PSSA Officers and Rehistro Mindoro Members) and everyone behind the program were very happy that they were able to implant leadership skills and knowledge to the participants.

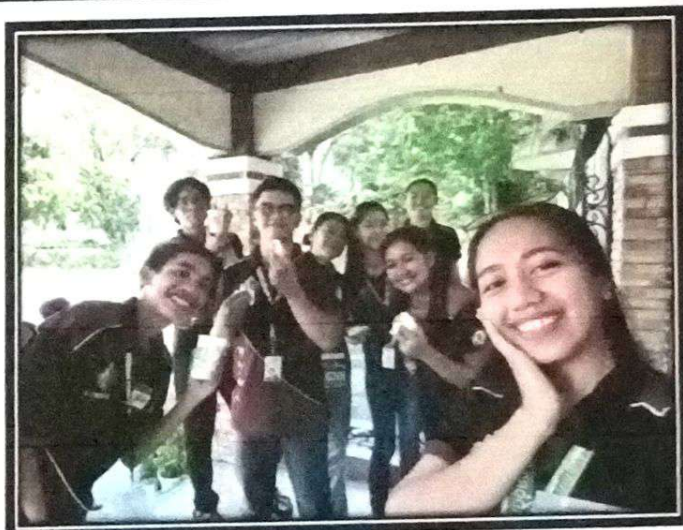
