



NARRATIVE REPORT ON SCHOOL VISITATION ACTIVITY FOR A.Y. 2024-2025

The Guidance Office in coordination with the University Admissions Office have conducted its annual School Visitation Activity for the incoming Academic Year 2025-2026. School Visitation Activity was conducted across the selected towns in the province of Oriental Mindoro. The main objectives of this activity were to promote the program offerings in MinSU, to highlight the Free Higher Education Law or the RA 10931, the application process and requirements for admission and the student activities and organizations. The activity was spearheaded by Ms. Heidelita G. Bumohya, Guidance Counselor III and Mr. Jessie Ray B. Mangundayao, University Admissions Officer. The team was composed of Ms. Kyla Danica O. Mayupao, Psychometrician, Ms. Mae Angela L. Bejer, GCO Admin Aide and Ms. Merryl Jane B. Ramos, UAO Admin Aide, all staff under the Department of Student Affairs and Services. Due to the hectic schedules and class workload, the other colleges would not be able to participate in the campaign. Only representatives from the College of Business and Management and College of Agriculture and Allied Fields have join the activity. With the invaluable support of the University, the school visitation activity started February 18, 2025 and ended successfully last March 11, 2025.

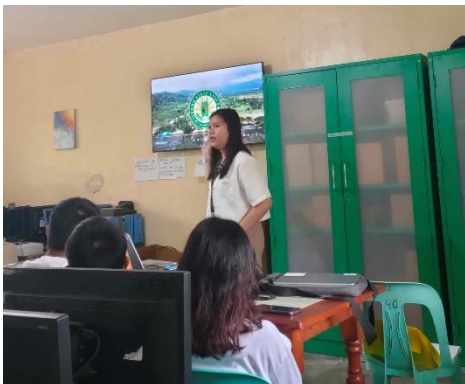

There were 3 sections in their Senior High School Department, one for STEM and two for HUMSS strands. The campaign was conducted simultaneously for each class. Questions arise after the discussion of the free tuition fee law, the program offerings and the application process for admissions.

The team arrived during lunch time at Fortuna National High School, Socorro, Oriental Mindoro despite having no appointment with the School Head. Fortunately, Mr. Estanislao L. Lambon Jr. welcomed the team and set the career talk at 1pm. The school only have one section of Senior High School Students, specifically HUMSS Strand. The team was accompanied by the Grade 12 Adviser. The talk started with the discussion of the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act or RA 10931. Followed by the application process and requirements for admissions. Lastly, the Guidance Counselor shared the school activities, competitions, scholarships and organizations that the students might have interest with. After the campaign, the team also delivered school visitation letters and communicated with the Principals/ School Heads at Mina De Oro Catholic School and Aurelio Arago Memorial National High School.

Continuing the mission to promote the Republic Act 10931, which aims to provide free tuition and other school fees for Filipino students in specified tertiary education institutions like Mindoro State University. The team composed of the Psychometrician and the GCO-Admin Aide conducted a school visitation activity and career talk at Malamig National High School, Gloria, Oriental Mindoro. Students from MNHS were attentive during the discussion of the free tuition fee law, the program offerings of the three campuses, the future career path of their chosen program and the application process for admissions. The talk went by simultaneously for the two sections of their HUMSS strand. After the presentation of the promotional video and inquiries from the students, the photo opportunity followed.

Afterwards, the team travelled from Gloria to Socorro and visited Mina De Oro Catholic School as scheduled by their Senior High School Coordinator. Upon arrival, the Acting Principal Ms. Mary Rose asked the Guidance Coordinator to accompany the team in the Senior High School Building. Their SHS Department has 2 sections, one for STEM and one for HUMSS strand. After the presentation of the RA 10931, the program offerings and the application process, questions from students arise. The students also asked about how difficult the entrance exam is, and if the university will provide any reviewers. Unfortunately, there is none. The entrance exam aims to determine the students preparedness and capabilities that fits their chosen program. The photo opportunity followed after all the inquiries.

Going back to MinSU, the team decided to deliver letter, brochures and posters to Fortunato Perez Memorial National High School, Victoria, Oriental Mindoro. Fortunately, the Teacher-In-Charge coordinated with their School Head Ms. Agnes Bumacod and allowed the team to conduct a career talk to the Grade 12 HUMSS students of FPMNHS. The students were gathered at their gymnasium. The talk started with highlighting the Free Higher Education Law which aims to provide access to tertiary education for free. The team highly encourage the students to prepare the necessary documents early. Most of the students were yet to decide about the program to take in college. The TIC also gave his motivation to the students to continue their education. After the photo opportunity, the team travelled to Oriental Mindoro Academy and Good Shepherd Academy to deliver letters and set a schedule for school campaign.

February 25, 2025

On this day, the team was composed only of the Guidance Counselor and the Psychometrician. The GCO-Admin Aide's presence was needed at the guidance office due to other services and concerns. Schools from Pola, Oriental Mindoro were visited today. Starting off at Matulatula National High School with an appointment scheduled by their Principal, Ms. Lezebel A. Gonzales. The team arrived early despite the long drive from MinSU Victoria to Pola. The Teacher-In-Charge welcomed and accompanied the team to the Senior High School Building. The talk started with the presentation of the promotional video, followed by the discussion of RA 10931, the application process and requirements, student activities, scholarships and the diverse organizations in MinSU. Some of the students already had their forms downloaded and asked about the appropriate details in the form. Afterwards, the team took photos with the students for documentation.

The team then arrived at Pola Catholic School at around 10 o'clock in the morning. Unfortunately, there were no classes at PCS because of the celebration of EDSA Revolution. The team communicated with the parish and handed out posters and brochures instead. The staff were very welcoming and agreed to bring the campaign materials to the school the following day. Afterwards, the team travelled to Calima National High School. The Teacher-In-Charge welcomed the team at their office and informed that their students were still at work immersion. With that being said, it is not possible to conduct a school campaign or career orientation so the team can only hand out brochures and posters to the TIC.

After noon break, the team visited Domingo Yu Chu National High School and delivered school campaign letter. The principal, Mr. Loreto S. Labrador scheduled the talk on March 4, 2025 as part of their Career Guidance Program.



February 27, 2025

As scheduled the MinSU team visited Aurelio Arago Memorial National High School, Leido, Victoria, Oriental Mindoro last February 27, 2025. The principal, Ms. Andrelyn Macadaeg was still on travel so the Teacher-In-Charge gave the permission to conduct a career talk instead. The TIC coordinated with the Guidance Designate and accompanied the team to the Senior High School Building. There were nine sections of Senior High School students at Aurelio and the team was composed only of the Guidance Counselor, the Psychometrician and the GCO-Admin Aide. The talk was conducted simultaneously, dividing the team into three. Fortunately, most of the students have already submitted their online application and there were only minimal questions arise during the talk. After the discussion of the free tuition fee law, the program offerings, the application requirements and process of admissions, the team took photos with the students.

Due to a large number of students at Aurelio Arago MNHS, it consumed more time than expected, the team arrived at Immaculate Heart of Mary Academy, Pinamalayan, Oriental Mindoro few minutes after the scheduled time. Upon arrival, the team went to the Principal's office, Mr. Arleen Janda and apologized for the delay. The principal assured that it was fine as the students were still preparing their rooms. Mr. Janda asked their Guidance Coordinator to accompany the MinSU team. There were two sections of Senior High School, however the other students were still at their work immersion activity. During the discussion, the students were very silent and curious about the admission test. One student asked if there was a reviewer given to the applicants, unfortunately, there is none. The talk went on and highlighted the importance of the RA 10931, and that all the programs offered at MinSU will be availed for free. The application process and requirements were also discussed.

Later that afternoon, the team visited Quinabigan National High School, Pinamalayan, Oriental Mindoro. The Senior High School Coordinator asked one of their faculty to accompany the team to their Senior High School Building. There were three sections of Grade 12 students, one for STEM strand and two for HUMSS. After disseminating the brochures, the discussion started simultaneously for each room. Some students already submitted their online application and just waiting for confirmation. While the others, still haven't decided on what college program and what school will they apply for. Upon sharing the important details on the Free Higher Education Law, the university program offerings of the three campuses and the application process, the students' inquiries arise.

March 3, 2025

During the Career Guidance Celebration of Leuteboro National High School, Mindoro State University alongside with other colleges and the Department of Labor and Employment of Oriental Mindoro conducted a career talk for Grade 12 graduating students at Leuteboro NHS Gymnasium, Socorro, Oriental Mindoro. The MinSU team was composed of the Guidance Counselor, Psychometrician and the GCO-Admin Aide. Ms. Ethel, the Guidance Counselor of LNHS hosted the program. MinSU team was arranged to give the talk after DOLE and the other colleges. Representatives from each school were given thirty minutes to discuss the programs and other offerings of their respective institutions.

Ms. Kyla Danica O. Mayupao, Psychometrician from MinSU introduce the university and its implementation of Republic Act 10931 which is the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act. This law provides free tuition fees in state universities like MinSU. Some students were not yet informed about the law and are having queries during the discussion. However, the questions will only be entertained after all the presentations. The application process and the requirements for university admissions were presented and elaborated by Ms. Mae Angela L. Bejer, the GCO-Administrative Aide. She also facilitated the discussion of the program offerings at the 3 campuses of Mindoro State University.

The remaining time was maximized by the Guidance Counselor, Ms. Heidelita G. Bumohya and shared experiences on the student activities, organizations, competitions, scholarships and other student-related happenings inside or even outside the university. Then, the promotional video was presented to show the facilities of the three campuses, the products crafted by the MinSU students, awards received, the program representatives and introduced the University President. After the presentations, each school was given another 5 minutes to promote their respective institutions then, the photo opportunity followed.

March 4, 2025

As part of the Career Guidance Celebration, the Domingo Yu Chu National High School of Pola, Oriental Mindoro has prepared a program for their Grade 12 graduating students in preparation to help them explore career options, make informed decisions, and develop their career path. The Mindoro State University as part of the program arrived at the school earlier than scheduled alongside with other colleges in Oriental Mindoro. The team then went to the Principal, Mr. Loreto S. Labrador to pay courtesy while waiting for the turn. Upon the given time, the team, composed of the Guidance Counselor, Psychometrician and the GCO-Admin Aide started with distributing brochures to the students. The flow of the discussion went from the Psychometrician highlighting the importance of the RA 10931 or the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act and the program offerings at MinSU. Then, the GCO-Admin Aide talked about the application process and requirements for admissions. Lastly, the Guidance Counselor shared the student-related activities, organizations, scholarships and some success stories of MinSU graduates in their chosen professions.

The Guidance Counselor initiated to pay a visit to Leandro S. Panganiban Sr.-Tagumpay High School to maximize the time being at Pola, Oriental Mindoro. The Mindoro State University team was welcomed by the Teacher-In-Charge since the principal Mr. Christopher M. Llave was on travel. The TIC allowed the team to conduct a career talk and promote the university to their Grade 12 HUMSS students. The team handed out the brochures as the Guidance Counselor started to introduce the Mindoro State University and the programs offered. She also talked about the Free Higher Education Law and how is it important not to miss the opportunity. Afterwards, the GCO-Admin Aide elaborated the process on how to apply and qualify for the university admissions. She discussed the requirements for application and the important dates for admissions. Before the talk ended, the Psychometrician gave additional details regarding the admission tests and the career opportunities of their chosen program. Unfortunately, there was no electricity at that moment so the promotional video wasn't played. Hence, the activity still ended successfully.

March 6, 2025

Upon the direct communication with Ms. Lolinie M. Ibon, the Principal of Good Shepherd Academy of Victoria, Inc., the Mindoro State University school campaign team was scheduled March 5, 2025, 9:30 in the morning. The principal welcomed the team to her office as she asked their Guidance Coordinator to accompany the team to their Senior High School building. There were six sections of Grade 12 at GSA, 3 sections for STEM, 2 for HUMSS and 1 for ABM strand. The team was composed of the Guidance Counselor, Psychometrician and the GCO-Admin Aide, so the campaign was conducted simultaneously. The span of each discussion was limited to 15 minutes each section because the next school to be visited was Scared Heart Academy in Gloria, Oriental Mindoro. Some of the students have already submitted their application online so after the discussion of the free tuition, the application process and requirements, the student activities and organizations, and the admission dates, there were only few questions arise. Many of them have shared their interest in entering Mindoro State University as their university choice.

The team travelled from Victoria to Gloria, Oriental Mindoro as scheduled by the Guidance Coordinator of Sacred Heart Academy in behalf of their Principal, Ms. Crisanta B. Semilla. There are five sections of Grade 12 composed of 2 sections for STEM and 3 for HUMSS. The talk was conducted only to the four sections as the remaining one was having their graduation photoshoot. Due to some technical difficulties, the promotional video was not presented hence the students were guided through the brochures. After the discussion of the free tuition fee law, the program offerings, the application requirements and process of admissions, the students were free to ask any inquiries. Before leaving, the MinSU team handed posters to SHA's Guidance Coordinator for the easier access of the online application link.

Last stop for this day was, Papandayan High School at Pinamalayan, Oriental Mindoro. The school principal was on travel so the Teacher-In-Charge allowed the team to conduct a school campaign instead. There is only one section of Grade 12 HUMSS in PHS. The talk started with the distribution of brochures while the Psychometrician started to introduce the RA 10931 or the Universal Access to Tertiary Education given to incoming first year students who will enter a state college or university like Mindoro State University. During the discussion of the programs, it seems that the students have yet to decide on their desired career path. The process of application and the admission requirements were elaborated by the GCO-Admin Aide. Finally, the Guidance Counselor shared student-related activities, organizations, scholarships and encourage the students to continue their tertiary education. The students assisted in the set-up of the promotional video, however due to some technical errors, the video wont play. The talk ended with a motivational message for the students to find what career they would want to pursue.

March 7, 2025

On this day, the location of the school visitation activity was at Pinamalayan, Oriental Mindoro. The first school visited was Buli High School. Unfortunately, the team does not have a scheduled appointment for there was no contact information of the new School Head. Upon arrival, the Grade 12 students were having their graduation pictorial so the school campaign and career talk was not possible to conduct. The team then was welcomed by the School Principal in her office and inquired about the programs and the admission process. Posters and brochures were also given to the Senior High School Coordinator instead.

After Buli High School, the MinSU team travelled to Cacawan National High School. Having the same event at Buli High School, their Grade 12 students were also having their graduation pictorial. The Senior High School Coordinator offered the team to stay in the principal's office for a while for they are going to wrap up the shoot in a few minutes. After the pictorial, the Grade 12 adviser accompanied the team to their classroom. There was only one section for HUMSS 12 at Cacawan High School. The talk went on with the discussion of RA 10931, the application process and requirements, student activities, scholarships and the diverse organizations in MinSU. Some students inquired about the career opportunities of the programs offered at the university. Brochures were disseminated and posters were given to their adviser.

The last school to be visited for this day was Calingag High School in Pinamalayan. Unfortunately, the school was having a culminating activity for their students and the team have found out the lack of student crisis in Calingag. The principal, Mr. Marvin S. Layron have shared that there was a possibility that their Senior High School will soon be close for there were only 6 graduating senior high school students and not more than 20 Grade 11 students for this year. Nonetheless, he still expressed his support on the MinSU campaign for their students and the team handed out posters and brochures to the School Principal.

March 11, 2025

The ultimate goal of the school visitation activity was not just to promote the university but also to inform the students on the Republic Act 10931 which aims to provide free tertiary education to incoming college students. Mindoro State University team composed of the Guidance Coordinator, Psychometrician, GCO-Admin Aide and the designated driver have reached the final day of the school campaign. The first school on the list was Bayuin National High School in Socorro, Oriental Mindoro. As ordered by the Principal, Mr. Roger G. Abante, the Grade 12 students were gathered in their Audio-Visual Room for the career talk and campaign. The team was accompanied by the Senior High School Coordinator to the AVR. The promotional video of MinSU was presented, then the Psychometrician facilitated the discussion of the RA 10931 followed. Afterwards, the GCO-Admin Aide presented the program offerings and the process and requirements for admissions. The last part of the talk was the Guidance Counselor and discussed about the student activities, organizations, competitions, scholarships and other student-related happenings inside or even outside the university. Students actively engage on the discussion and inquired questions about the university.

After Bayuin High School, the team travelled to Oriental Mindoro Academy in Victoria. The School Principal, Ms. Daily R. Nilo asked their students to assemble at their audio-visual room as the venue of the career talk. There were two sections of Grade 12, one for HUMSS and the other one is for ABM. The brochures were disseminated while the Psychometrician began the talk with highlighting the importance of the Free Tuition Fee law and elaborated the programs offered at Mindoro State University. Next, the application process for admissions was discussed by the GCO-Admin Aide. Students have expressed that some of them already passed their application but have been rejected. The team advised them to create a new email account and submit another application with the given corrections. Lastly, the Guidance Coordinator shared the student activities, events, competitions and organizations to expect once they enter the university.



(Oriental Mindoro Academy)



Before going back to MinSU Main Campus, the team through the initiative of the Guidance Counselor decided to bring posters and brochures to Macatoc National High School. Upon meeting with the School Principal, Mr. Edgardo J. Villarba, he proposed that the team should conduct a campaign and career talk to their Senior High School students. he ordered the Senior High School Coordinator to accompany the team to their SHS building. There are four sections of Grade 12, two for HUMSS, one for SMAW and one for ABM. Most of the students have already submitted their application form and waiting for approval. Others have yet to decide on their program and what campus they will apply for. The talk went on simultaneously as the team went to each rooms individually. After the discussion of the RA 10931, the requirements and application process and the program offerings, few questions about the future career opportunities arise.

The overall activity for this year's School Visitation was successful through the collaborative efforts of Guidance and Counseling Office and the Admission Office. However, a success wasn't always connotes smooth and perfect implementation of an activity. With this regards the recommendations and suggestions of the office for the future conduct of the activity:

- May this kind of activity be planned ahead of time most specifically the activity outline, assignment of the persons involved and the materials may distributed prior the implementation.
- When requesting permit of the Visitation from the School Division, may we encourage to process the endorsement letter ahead of time or by the month of November to receive the approved endorsement letter prior the conduct of activity.
- The approved endorsement letter together with the letter of conducting the Visitation on each schools may also be deliver ahead of time for a prior notice to the School Principals for a formal appointment of schedule in visiting their schools.
- The brochures may have an updated information including the schedules of application, admission test, release of results and other necessary requirements for the target audience.
- The posters may have an updated layout for accurate distinction of yearly visitation.
- With regards of the promotional video, may we have an updated uniform display of the University and representations of the OJT uniform from each colleges enable to provide an accurate distinction of courses offered in the University.
- This activity in which the University was represented may need a full efforts and support from other sectors of the institution to properly engage and encourage abundant aspiring MinSUans, wherein the necessary information could be provided with essential details and explanations from a reliable sources.
- Faculty from each programs may encourage to express interest in representing the University in yearly school campaign, share the achievements and accomplishment of their department and their learners.
- As each campuses allotted different time in conducting the Visitation, may we encourage to have uniformed schedules and span of time to conduct the said activity.

Moreover, the unity of the Faculties, Admission, and Guidance Office would be a great benefit to the future of the University.
